Pastoral Notes:

EXTRAVAGANT DISCIPLESHIP

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Here's the thing: the older I get, the more I come to understand and experience the Kingdom of God in dynamic, extravagant terms. I have come to see more clearly that Jesus teaches paints the Kingdom in bright, bold colors, never in beiges or pastels. Read Jesus' parables, the stories of the Kingdom and you'll see how true it is. AT THE SAME TIME, (here's the rub), the older I get, I find myself sometimes slipping into a complacency, or a comfortable contentment about life. When I was younger, I wanted to change the world...now I am happy to just change myself, and that only in minor, little ways. I realize, of course, with age, comes limits. But, then, there is Jesus preaching about a Kingdom that goes beyond limits, a Kingdom not contained by practicality, a Kingdom that is bigger than my imagination. But my imagination isn't what it used to be. Isn't that sad?

Thank God, then, for the poor, old widow we meet in today's Gospel (the gospel doesn't tell us she is old, but historically she is pictured that way and for my purposes here, it works if she is old!). "The Widow's Mite," her story is called. The woman gives EVERYTHING she has, her entire livelihood. This teaches me something. Perhaps it is possible to grow older and still live as an extravagant disciple. The Poor Widow is the Patron Saint of Wild Discipleship. "Help us to give all and everything for the sake of God's Kingdom!"

Gospel: Mark 13:24-32

Reflection on the Gospel Reading

The 2005-2006 Liturgical year ends next week. Today's Gospel passage from Mark is about end times and the final days of humanity. Jesus addressed His disciples about how the world's light will fail to compare with His own power and glory. Jesus will gather His faithful disciples from every place in creation to be with Him. Jesus promised that His words would never pass away. The final day was known only to the Father.

Reflection Questions:

Believe: How do I feel about encountering Jesus at the end of time as He appears with great power and glory?

Share: In light of today's Gospel, how do I feel about having all people with Jesus at the end of time?

Transform: In light of today's Gospel, what do I believe is the ultimate destination of creation?

PRAY FOR EACH OTHER

Pray together for any petitions and any needs that you might have. Stand in a circle together and say the Our Father. Pray daily this week for the person on your right.

LEAVE TO EVANGELIZE YOUR WORLD

Reflect on your mission to grow deeper in your relationship with God. Be welcoming, offer hospitality and work for transformation in your daily life.

Suggestions for this coming week:

Believe: In prayer, imagine yourself witnessing the final coming of Jesus at the end of time, when He sends an angel to gather you to Him. Tell Him what you think and how you feel.

Share: Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you this week to invite someone hungering for love and meaning to attend Mass with you.

Transform: Do something to address the conditions of homelessness, poverty, hunger, illiteracy – to help others find greater justice and peace in their lives.

Social Concerns

The Sudan in Africa is a large country with many geographic extremes, ranging from sandy desert to tropical rain forest. The Sudan is home to almost 600 tribes, with Arabic as their common language. The French, English and Italians have all had colonies in the Sudan. The UN has currently estimated the population at 37 million. The Sudan has two distinct major cultures, Arabs with Nubian (Kushite) roots and non Arab black Africans, consisting of hundreds of ethnic and tribal divisions and language groups. This makes collaboration with them difficult. The official languages of the Sudan are Arabic and English. Sudan's largest Christian denominations are Roman Catholic, the Episcopal Church of Sudan, the Presbyterian Church of Sudan and the Coptic Orthodox Church. Estimates have put the Muslim population at 65%, including Arab and non Arab groups. Christianity makes up 10%, while traditionalists make up 35%. The constitution provides for freedom of religion, however, in practice the Government continues to impose many restrictions on non-Muslims, non-Arab Muslims and those from tribes and sects not affiliated with the ruling party. Although the Government has not actually interfered with worship and does not arrest or detain persons for practicing their religion, it treats its form of Islam as the state religion and declares that Islam must inspire the countries laws, institutions and policies.

The U.S. government has imposed a series of aid and trade sanctions on Sudan for several years and this past week renewed those sanctions. In a policy review on the Sudan this week, President Bush said he would seek a new plan for Darfur acceptable to the Sudanese government. This comes after repeatedly failing to obtain Sudanese government compliance with a U.S. sponsored UN resolution demanding the deployment of UN peacekeepers in Darfur. Andrew Natsios, the President's personal envoy to Sudan, visited the country last week and brought back a grim report to the President as the fighting between rebel and government forces intensifies. The President states that the United States will work with the international community to come up with a plan on how to address this issue and save lives. The African Faith and Justice Network call upon the U.S. to use its influence within the Sudanese Government to demand that an environment of protection is created in Darfur. If the Sudanese Government cannot or will not do this the responsibility falls on the international community. In the mean time, the people of Darfur are suffering.

Please stand with the people of Darfur by lending them our prayers, our support, and voices to their plight
